It has been set up to take forward two Crossrail lines - line 1 (west-east, shown in this leaflet) and line 2 (southwest-northeast). This leaflet is about line 1 only.

Crossrail is seen as the most important project for a generation. It will tackle congestion on the rail system and elsewhere, and reduce overcrowding on trains. Connections with other forms of transport will be improved. Trains will be accessible to everyone. Crossrail will help to create a more sustainable environment by encouraging more people to leave their cars at home.

Work and leisure possibilities open up with Crossrail. Jobs will be created in building it. Other jobs will be secured in the areas it serves. Communities will benefit from regeneration supported by Crossrail. New areas will be opened up for housing and employment in the Thames Gateway area. The UK's economic health will be underpinned by better transport serving its financial and business heartland.
